An introduction to LSCP training

Who is eligible to attend training?

You must work or volunteer with an organisation that provides services to children and/or their families who live in, or who are looked after by, the London Borough of Lambeth to access LSCP training.

How much does it cost?

All our training is free to access provided that you meet the above eligibility requirements.

Who delivers the training?

The Lambeth Safeguarding Children Partnership (LSCP) runs the training. Some of our courses are delivered by an LSCP trainer, others are delivered by external trainers. Please check the course description for more detail.

What different types of training do you offer?

To accommodate diverse learning styles and requirements, we provide four different approaches to training and learning:



What are the training levels?

Level 1

- **Introductory courses**
- Cover basic safeguarding content. You will gain knowledge on what safeguarding is and explore how to recognise signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect, and also how to report your concerns. They are aimed at people **who come into contact with children, young people and/or their parents carers**. For example, receptionists, volunteers and local authority staff.

Level 2

- **Intermediate courses**
- Cover basic safeguarding content in more depth, like how to report and respond to concerns. They are aimed at people **who have a duty of care towards children**. For example, youth workers, teachers, social workers and early years practitioners.

Level 3


- **Advanced courses**
- Cover key safeguarding topics in more details, like how to respond to specific types of harm and develop the skills needed to safeguard children. They are aimed at those **who are in a position of management or responsible for making key decisions with regard to safeguarding children**, like contributing to multiagency safeguarding responses. For example, safeguarding officers, nursery managers, GPs, headteachers, local authority staff and VCS Leads.

Level 4

- **Specific to role**
- Bespoke training and recommended training from safeguarding practice reviews, national reviews and learning practice reports. These are Level 4 courses that are suitable for safeguarding champions that will ensure the learning is cascaded in their organisations.



Amity relationships toolkit	
What does it cover?	<p>This course, and the Amity Relationship Toolkit itself, is a flexible, practical resource designed to support and help build your skills as someone who works with parents, children, and families. Positive relationships hold the key to good parenting, which in turn impacts children's well-being, self-esteem and future life chances. Essentially, it's the people around us that will get us through life's ups and downs. We'll look at ways we can support families to have stronger, healthier relationships with more positive communication to ensure that all parents can be the best they can be. The Relationship Toolkit is packed with information, tools, and resources to help you support parents communicate better. It will help you in your everyday practice to be more confident and curious about family relationship quality.</p>

✓ Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

Anyone who works or volunteers with children and families living in, or looked after by, Lambeth is encouraged to attend, particularly those who complete safeguarding referrals and assessment, or contribute to multiagency working.

🔍 Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to understand how racism and bias can adversely impact safeguarding responses and develop the skills to explore and address these issues when working with children and families.

📖 What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Identify the origins of race and racism
- Recognise how racism can manifest into dangerous safeguarding practice and the impact for children and families
- Understand what is meant by intersectionality and the importance of curiosity about all elements of child and family identity
- Apply critical thinking skills when considering how intersectionality and oppression can translate into increased risk of harm to children
- Understand how cultural competence can strengthen responses to children and families and identify practical ways to balance cultural sensitivity and challenging harmful behaviour
- Identify creative approaches to removing service access barriers and create conditions to encourage engagement

Breaking the silence: child sexual abuse in the family

✓ Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

People who work or volunteer with children living in, or looked after by, Lambeth are encouraged to attend; especially those in regular contact with children.

🔍 Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to recognise the signs of child sexual abuse in the family and improve your confidence to respond.

📖 What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Describe the different ways which children can be sexually abused in the family and the prevalence of this type of abuse
- Explain why children find it difficult to talk about sexual abuse and how to recognise indicators of sexual abuse
- Be more confident to respond to disclosures of child sexual abuse
- Understand how abusers operate and develop knowledge of the models of grooming
- Identify the impact and role of non-abusing parents
- Describe what needs to be considered when assessing and responding to child sexual abuse
- Explain what local support pathways are available for children

Anyone who works or volunteers with children and families living in, or looked after by, Lambeth is encouraged to attend, particularly those who complete safeguarding referrals and assessment, or contribute to multiagency working.

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to understand the importance of professional curiosity and develop skills to apply this in your safeguarding practice.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Define what is meant by professional curiosity and why it matters
- Identify what can prevent professional curiosity in practice and how this can lead to dangerous safeguarding practice
- Apply critical thinking skills to risk and needs assessment
- Understand how to use the voice of the child to meaningfully measure outcomes
- Identify creative ways to engage and capture the voices of children with a range of needs
- Recognise the importance of exploring and analysing parental behaviours and household/family dynamics

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to understand the dangers that children face in the online world and develop skills to recognise and respond to these through a safeguarding framework.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:


- Describe the different dangers children face online and develop knowledge of the current platforms which children engage with
- Identify children who are at increased vulnerability to online risk
- Recognise indicators that children are at risk in the online world
- Assess the level of online risk and improve confidence to respond and support children
- Support children to engage safely with the online world
- Support parents to support their children to keep safe online
- Reflect on how you and your service can improve safeguarding responses to children who are at risk online

Staff and volunteers who work with residents who are fleeing domestic abuse in Lambeth.

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to understand what domestic abuse is and the available housing options for victims and survivors of domestic abuse.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)


By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Understand how violence against women and girls (VAWG) is experienced by victims and survivors
- Identify and respond appropriately to victims and survivors at risk of/affected by VAWG
- Understand the barriers faced by victims and survivors to accessing support
- Know where to refer victims and survivors to access specialist support
- Understand the different housing options available to victims and survivors of domestic abuse
- Increase knowledge on different pathways available to victims and survivors of domestic abuse.

Harmful sexual behaviour

Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

People who work or volunteer with children living in, or looked after by, Lambeth are encouraged to attend; especially those in regular contact with children. People working with parents, carers and families are also encouraged to attend.

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to develop knowledge about what constitutes harmful sexual behaviour and to respond in a way which supports and safeguards these children.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)


By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Explain the different types of sexual behaviour children can display
- Recognise when this behaviour is problematic or harmful
- Reflect on the reasons why children might behave this way
- Understand and navigate complexities in identifying and responding to harmful sexual behaviours
- Identify ways to support and safeguard children who display harmful sexual behaviours

Multi-agency safeguarding

✓ Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

All staff and volunteers who make key decisions in regards to safeguarding, including safeguarding referrals and multi-agency working, should attend this training. This training should be undertaken at least every 2 years by safeguarding leads and every 3 years for other staff with responsibilities at level 3 competency.

🔍 Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to develop the knowledge and skills to identify, assess and respond to safeguarding children concerns in line with Working Together To Safeguard Children.

📖 What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Describe the legal framework for safeguarding children and associated duties
- Define the different types of abuse and neglect children can experience
- Recognise the indicators of abuse and neglect
- Explain how to respond to disclosures or indicators of harm with professional curiosity
- Identify the thresholds for action and different levels of response
- Apply critical thinking and risk analysis skills to indicators of harm to inform responses and referrals
- Define what constitutes a good quality referral to Lambeth children's social care and explain what happens after referrals are made
- Recognise the challenges of multi-agency working and the adverse impact this can have on safeguarding responses
- Develop best practice approaches to multi-agency working and information sharing
- Recognise the importance of professional challenge and explain how to escalate concerns

Navigating adult needs and behaviours in child safeguarding

✓ Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

This training is ideal both for people who work with vulnerable adults and for people working in roles with safeguarding duties to children.

🔍 Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to develop your knowledge around how adult needs, vulnerabilities and behaviours can impact the safety of children and develop the skills to effectively assess and respond to adults to achieve better outcomes for children.

📺 What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Define what legal duties are attached to parental responsibility and what constitutes 'good enough' parenting
- Identify a range of factors that can adversely affect parenting ability and describe the potential impact for children
- Understand the common challenges when working with vulnerable adults and how this can lead to dangerous child safeguarding practice
- Apply critical thinking skills when identifying and assessing whether adult vulnerability needs a child safeguarding response and
- Describe how to respond when adult vulnerability increases risk of harm to children
- Identify when adult behaviours and responses to offers of help and support increase the risk of harm to children
- Describe and apply best practice approaches when working with 'hard to engage' adults.

Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

Anyone who works or volunteers with children and families living in, or looked after by, Lambeth is encouraged to attend, particularly those who complete safeguarding referrals and assessment, or contribute to multiagency working.

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to develop the confidence to identify, assess and respond to neglect using the Lambeth Neglect Toolkit.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)


By the end of the course, you will be able to:


- Describe the different types of neglect that children can experience in the modern context
- Recognise indicators of neglect and what can make it difficult to spot these
- Explain how to use the neglect toolkit to assess neglect

- Identify how to respond using the pan-London levels of need framework
- Reflect on what makes it difficult to identify, assess and respond to neglect in practice and how to avoid this.

Prevent Duty

Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

Staff and volunteers who engage with members of the public and may need to make a Prevent referral due to concerns about the risk of radicalisation. Education setting staff may attend, but specialist training is available for their settings which may be more appropriate.

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to recognise the signs of possible radicalisation and understand how to respond, including when and how to make referrals to Prevent.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)


By the end of the course, you will be able to:


- Demonstrate an understanding of Prevent aims, terminologies, and processes
- Explain how the risk people we work with might manifest, and at what point concerns should be raised
- Explain how Prevent-related cases work once a referral is made and show awareness of the wider support options available to professionals and service users.

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to develop and understanding of the types of abuse and exploitation children can experience outside of their homes and families and to improve your confidence to respond using contextual safeguarding approaches.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)


By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Describe the different types of risk and harm children experience outside their home in Lambeth
- Identify contributing factors, including family contexts and structural inequalities
- Develop confidence to use risk assessment tools to identify the level of risk and best way to respond
- Understand the importance of using disruption tactics to reduce risk
- Explain best practice approaches to working with children and families and how to build protective factors.

Safer in school: responding to educational neglect and children not in full time education

✓ Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

Anyone who works with children who are of compulsory school age, or who works with their families, is encouraged to attend.

🔍 Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

This training will help you to recognise children not in full time education as a safeguarding matter and improve your confidence to support them within the multiagency safeguarding framework.

📖 What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Understand why children are safer in education
- Explain the legal responsibilities that parents, schools and local authorities have regarding children's education
- Describe what constitutes educational neglect
- Recognise other factors which can prevent children from accessing education
- Reflect on what makes it difficult to respond to children not in full time education and how this can adversely impact safeguarding responses
- Develop confidence to explore education as a safeguarding matter
- Identify local support pathways and best practice approaches to supporting children and families.

Section 47 unlocked: multiagency child protection in practice

Who should attend? (*Target audience*)

Staff who contribute to child protection responses including information sharing, referrals and attendance at multiagency meetings.

Why should they attend? (*Course aims*)

The training will help you to understand how child protection concerns are identified and investigated and improve confidence to contribute to these enquiries.

What will they gain? (*Course objectives*)

By the end of the course, you will be able to:


- Define what is meant by significant harm and factors to consider when identifying this
- Understand the importance of information sharing and when consent should be overridden
- Explain how child protection enquiries are progressed under S47 of the Children Act 1989

Signs of safety, wellbeing and success: multiagency introduction session




